MEETING CALLED TO ORDER:

- Chair Julius Fleschner welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order
- Lucy Harrison conducted roll/attendance of the group
- The agenda for the meeting was presented by Lucy Harrison and approved
- The minutes from the 2022 Spring General RACL meeting held virtually on April 22, 2022, were approved

GENERAL GALILEO UPDATES:

Lucy Harrison welcomed Julie Walker, Vice Chancellor for Libraries & Archives and State Librarian, Georgia Public Library Service and Christopher Davidson, J.D., State Archivist and Assistant Vice Chancellor, Georgia Archives to the meeting.

Joy Woodson provided the following GALILEO Marketing update:

- GIL Users Group Meeting
 - Virtual (Survey sent to past attendees indicated most wanted a virtual conference)
 - May 16-18, 2023 (Save-the-dates will be sent this fall to the public)
 - Due to GALILEO's current RFP process, we will not start planning the conference until February 2023, at the earliest
 - Keynote speakers: TBD (Have ideas? Let us know)
- GALILEO Annual Conference
 - In person, Middle Georgia State University
 - o June 14, 2023
 - Attendance will be capped at 150 people
 - Additional K-12 professional development during the year
 - Call for proposals will be sent out February 2023
 - GALILEO Ambassador entries will be opened in the spring
 - Keynote speakers TBD
- GALILEO Annual User Survey
 - November 3-30, 2023
 - New survey platform caused high spam response rate (even with Capcha) so we put it behind the login
 - Data will be available in December, but results will be announced to the public in January
 - Winner of the gift card will be notified early December before schools close for the winter holiday

Russell Palmer provided the following overview of the GALILEO December Development Highlights:

• Official release date for the new features for GALILEO for this year will be December 19, 2022

- Making a lot of progress on publication finder filtering, Primo filtering for journals, GALILEO and DLG and EBSCO discovery service filtering
- Big part of next push will be refining our Bento filters that are already there and functioning in our staging site
- Consulting with GALILEO Development Advisory Committee on Bento refinement
- Planning user testing during next Bento meeting
- Planning some new boxes including one specifically for DLG
- Behind the scenes work on DPLA Bento, Civil Rights Digital Library (CRDL) Bento and Georgia Historic Newspaper (GHNP) Bento

Russell further provided a review of the Bento filtering and full-page results and the Digital Library of Georgia Bento box; and a demonstration of the basics of the PowerNotes functionality and its integration into Web search results.

Lucy Harrison provided the following general GALILEO updates:

- Inclusive Access: After speaking with several other state initiatives and USG institutions, she is working on a proposal to change the BOR policy. Next steps include a report to the Executive Vice Chancellors. We will also try to negotiate some statewide preferred pricing.
- ICOLC Report: Lucy provided an overview of the latest ICOLC Task Force report, which is available here: <u>https://icolc.net/statements/</u> RACL members are asked to please review we may have further discussion in spring as part of strategic planning.

E-RESOURCES UPDATE:

John Stephens reported that we are still negotiating transformative agreements with ACS and Cambridge. Also working on the Elsevier renewals.

John will be providing the data for ACRL Question 45 soon. The FY22 usage report is now available at our Data & Statistics page. Overall, we are seeing flat usage compared to last year (PQ up, Infobase down, EBSCO flat). Several new resources were added in August. Other statistics of interest:

- PsycINFO and PsycARTICLES
 - Previously 17 USG institutions purchased PsycARTICLES through a costshare in FY19
 - Combined usage went up a small amount when we added 8 additional sites and has dropped since then
- Films on Demand
 - USG subscribes centrally to Films on Demand Master Academic Collection
 - Drop in usage this year after a general upward trend in usage
- MLA
 - Another substantial drop in usage for FY22
 - Two institutions subscribe to the Full Text upgrade (+0)
- Westlaw
 - Overall usage is up (mostly due to GSU)

- CINAHL
 - The CINAHL Index is purchased centrally for USG
 - 20 sites subscribe to one of the CINAHL upgrade products through costshare. Compared to last year: 3 for CINAHL w/ full text (+0), 8 for Plus w/ Full Text (+0), and 9 for Complete (+0)
 - Another overall decline in searches and full text usage
- MEDLINE w/ Full Text
 - Usage seems steady
 - Statistical Abstracts
 - Only have links metric, but usage appears to be fairly steady the last few years
- Dissertation Abstracts
 - Usage returned to FY20 level after a spike in FY21
 - 8 institutions purchase the full text upgrade through costshares

REPORT FROM CHAIR OF USG PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE:

Jay Forrest, Chair of the GALILEO Portfolio Analysis Committee (GPAC), provided an update of the GPAC Survey Report.

ILS RFP UPDATE:

Sean Boyle provided an update on the ILS RFP. We have now completed the Planning and Posting phases and are almost done with the Evaluation phase. Evaluation Team began meeting once the RFP closed (July 27th). The Evaluation Team includes 18 members:

- Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) from Functional teams/committees
- ➢ GIL support members
- GALILEO dev/support members
- Administrators from institutions and BOR

The Evaluation Team scored the initial vendor responses and the feedback from the demos. Some members scored the entirety of RFP, others were assigned specific RFP sections. The Evaluation Team members could ask outside SMEs (committees, etc.) for input if the SME had signed the confidentiality agreement. On October 21, the Evaluation Team reviewed the completed scores including pricing. The remaining Vendors will have an opportunity to provide some additional answers and clarification and to provide adjusted pricing. There are still a lot of details and concerns to be worked out, including pricing, development capabilities/timeline, and integration/system/architecture "gaps." We are moving into the Negotiation phase with a smaller team and are still eyeing a February/March decision.

 - Create a repository of free catalog records sourced from National Libraries, CZ records, and participating Alma institutions
 - CAT Team and GIL staff met with WRLC NZ manager in June
 - Discussed initiative details
 - Q&A <u>https://docs.google.com/presentation/d/1hJREUwBFzX4MMjSZUBMbmvEA</u> <u>aALZd8Yjj0GdB0xysow/edit#slide=id.g12ef6cb01c0_0_10</u>

 - Integration process involves
 - Record export from ArchivesSpace
 - Record conversion from Dublin Core to XML
 - ➢ Mapping of display fields in Alma
 - In production at UNG, starting conversations with other USG libraries
 - Phase 2 of project would involve automating record export
