- Members provided updates on their current status and plans for operating during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Toby initiated a discussion on the potential of HathiTrust to provide access to print resources. It was determined that InCommon membership is a barrier to wider implementation beyond the 6 USG institutions who are Hathi Trust members. Russell Palmer shared that a meeting to discuss the potential of OpenAthens to work with HathiTrust was planned for next week.
- Lucy Harrison mentioned the need to come up with a long-term solution to the courier, if it does not resume soon.
- Lucy provided an update on the Alma negotiations
 - An agreement was reached that resulted in a price decrease, but the difference is not enough to make up for the portion that the central office is supplementing (\$250,000)
 - Ex Libris has tripled our sandboxes from 4 to 12 and added a subscription to Syndetics Unbound
 - GIL costs should not be more than 2% increase
 - We still want to do a competitive bid. We should start talking about this time next year. By that time, open source solutions like Folio will be more mature
