Thank you for your inquiry regarding the Missouri Department of Higher Education (MDHE) policy on distance education from out-of-state public institutions

The MDHE requires out-of-state public institutions offering postsecondary education to students in Missouri to affirm, in writing, that the institution is accredited by a regional accrediting body, and that the institution will adhere to the MDHE Principles of Good Practice for Distance Learning and Web-Based Courses. (Policy for the Review of Academic Program Proposals)

Out-of-state public institutions wishing to offer distance education in Missouri in compliance with the U.S. Department of Education guidelines should submit a letter to the MDHE (at the address listed below) affirming their compliance with both regional accrediting standards and the MDHE Principles of Good Practice for Distance Learning and Web-Based Courses.

Please note this statement is only applicable to <u>out-of-state public institutions</u>. All other institutions should refer to <u>Proprietary School Certification</u> for information on offering distance education within the state.
