

# Creating Direct Links to GALILEO Databases

1. Locate the database by clicking on "Databases A-Z" tab. Search or browse for the database you want to link to.

2. Right click on the link to the database to copy the GALILEO Express Link. In Firefox, the option is called: "Copy Link Location." In Internet Explorer, "Copy Shortcut," In Safari, "Add the Bookmark to your Browser's Bookmark Collection."

3. Paste the “copied” GALILEO Express Link into print documents. For example, here is a Science Resources for K-12 handout.
