OCLC Resource Sharing

- 25 years of reliability
- More than 7,000 libraries, resource centers and document suppliers globally
- Handles about 10 million requests each year



Current Resource Sharing

- ILL Web illweb.oclc.org
- Passport for ILL Windows application
- **ILL ME** Windows application
- ILLiad Windows application



NEW: One Sharing Tool for Everyone

- Your resource sharing staff uses a Web interface incorporating FirstSearch functionality (FirstSearch account not required)
- Existing interfaces—except ILLiad—are retired simultaneously in 2005
- Batch options for high-volume, high-productivity libraries to be provided prior to ILL ME retirement
- OCLC Interlibrary Loan becomes WorldCat Resource Sharing

NEW: Subscription

- Unlimited WorldCat Resource Sharing services (searching, holdings, produces)
- Unlimited use of Fee Management and statistics
- Unlimited online union listing
- Lending credit history incorporated into quote



NEW: Simplified Transaction

- Only 3 fees:
 - Flat fee for unlimited holdings display and scan/browse
 - Charge for produce
 - Charge for Fee Management
- Lending credits still provided
- Default pricing for libraries not on subscription



Why Is This Migration Happening?

- Library technology and usage are trending toward:
 - Web-based catalogs and other applications
 - Patron self-service
 - Increased automation and interoperability of systems
 - Decreased per-unit costs



Why Is This Migration Happening? (cont'd)

- Powerful FirstSearch search capabilities
- More WorldCat-based activities within a library are integrated
- Single platform = Reduced information costs




Migration Benefits for Libraries

- Easier to use and budget for resource sharing
- Increase sharing accuracy and fill rates
- Turn around requests more quickly
- Integration with OPAC increases visibility of local fulfillment options, saving money
- End users have a better experience and can do more of the work themselves
- More request processing options










Multiple Holdings Options






Batch Printing of Request Categories

User Registration

- Patrons and staff can create accounts
- Save and delete searches
- Patron tracking of resource sharing requests
- Set personal preferences
- Forgotten password reminder e-mail




User Registration > Create ID






User Registration > Saved searches






User Registration > Self-tracking of requests

Additional New Features

- Link to Copyright Clearance Center
- Limit resource sharing on materials you already own
- Display of Lender LDR (Local Data Record) in requests



More New Features Coming Soon

- Automatic logon
- Staff access to new WorldCat Resource Sharing interface regardless of FirstSearch subscription status
- Staff can place a resource sharing request from all FirstSearch databases




More New Features in 2005

- Batch processing and transfer (ILL ME functionality)
- Routing of requests to multiple authorizations
- Routing and rules based on LDRs and Policies Directory data
- Smart use of Fee Management
- Improved access to local availability information
- More batch printing in Request Manager
- Additional user registration benefits



When Can I Begin Using the New Interface?

- Activate WorldCat Resource Sharing for your staff
 - www.oclc.org/ill/migration/quickstart_illuserrequests.pdf
- Go to *firstsearch.oclc.org* and use your resource sharing authorization

- Libraries with a FirstSearch account:
 - **Available now**

- Libraries without a FirstSearch account:
 - **Available October 2004**



When Should I Begin Migrating?

■ ILL Web / Passport / ILL ME

Begin using WorldCat Resource Sharing on or after Aug. 15 for basic borrowing & lending

(High-productivity features available by early 2005)

■ ILLiad

Upgrade to Version 6.4 now; upgrade to 7.0 in December 2004 to ensure uninterrupted service



When Should I Begin Migrating? (cont'd)

Don't have to switch all at once—use WorldCat Resource Sharing in tandem with current interface



When Will My Current Sharing Interface Stop Working?

End date is May 1, 2005

- ILL Web will redirect to the logon page for WorldCat Resource Sharing
- Passport / ILL ME / ILLiad 6.x or earlier will no longer function
- Countdown provided on daily message

Migration schedule for WorldCat Resource Sharing interfaces







Chart current as of 8/15/04




Current Situation - Challenges

- No current union catalog representing statewide resources
- Users cannot easily access <u>all</u> available resources



Library Challenges Presenting/linking resources



Desired Situation

- Single, easy-to-use discovery tool of all Georgia resources
- Increase visibility of Georgia library collections
- Leverage existing cooperation between libraries statewide
- Efficient resource sharing




Characteristics of Ideal Solution

- Holdings of all Georgia libraries represented in catalog
- Uses existing infrastructure
- Minimal training
- Economical solution
- Improve service to Georgians statewide

- Unlimited cataloging services






Create a Group Catalog with What You Already Have in WorldCat



Create Geographic Scoping Levels








Florida Group Catalog search
