Are your Distance Education Courses really Correspondence Courses?

Recent federal legislation governing state authorization of distance education is raising concerns with some institutions on how their courses are classified.

A recent blog post from WICHE Cooperative for Educational Technologies (WCET) chronicles the Department of Education audit findings of a small, Indiana-based Catholic College called St. Mary-of-the-Woods.

The DOE's Office of the Inspector General determined that many distance education courses offered by the school should have been classified as correspondence courses. As a result the college was presented with a bill to refund \$42 million dollars in financial aid disbursed over a five year period.

The bill was based on the rule that institutions are not eligible to participate in any Title IV programs if 50 percent or more of their students were enrolled in correspondence course during its latest complete award year.

As the WCET author point out, for most institutions these new regulations should not be a problem. The majority of distance

education courses are classified correctly with the new guidelines and you must have 50% or more of your enrollments must be classified as correspondence to lose Title IV funding. These two factors are unlikely to apply to many institutions, but it is important to understand how the definitions may or may not affect your classes.

The published definitions from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools are as follows:

- Distance Education –a formal education process in which the majority of the instruction (interaction between students and instructors and among students) in a course occurs when students and instructors are not in the same place. Instruction may be synchronous or asynchronous.
- Correspondence Education –a formal educational process under which the institution provides instructional materials, by mail or electronic transmission, including examinations on the materials, to students who are separated from the instructor. Interaction between the instructor and the student is limited, is not regular and substantive, and is primarily initiated by the student courses are typically self-paced.
