COLLEGE ACCESS CHALLENGE GRANT PROGRAM

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The College Access Challenge Grant program seeks to increase postsecondary degree attainment of P-12 students traditionally underrepresented in higher education. It also works to increase degree attainment of Georgia's

low-income adults with some college credit but no degree.

The College Access Challenge Grant program emphasizes performance, partnerships, and the overall value to higher education as part of its metrics for success.

KEY POINTS

- U.S. Department of Education grants of over \$12 million have been awarded since 2008 and matched by state funds of \$6 million.
- Implementation of Georgia's College Access Plan is led by the University System of Georgia (USG) on behalf of the Governor's Office and the Alliance of Education Agency Heads.
- Project is led within USG by the Office of Educational Access & Success (OEAS), along with a crossagency leadership team.
- Target groups of interest for USG include first-time freshmen, transfer students, adults returning to college, and the military.

OVERVIEW

The Problem: Too few Georgians possess the credentials needed for good jobs and a competitive economy.

- 81% of Georgia's jobs require some kind of training/education after high school.
- Yet only 36% of Georgia's adults hold a two- or four-year degree.
- In particular, low-income individuals are traditionally underrepresented in higher education.
- Low-income adults who have "stopped out" are in danger of not completing degrees.
- The Solution: The College Access Challenge Grant works to fill in gaps and enhance state resources.
- Provides information, hands-on support, and resources to underrepresented K-12 students to prepare them for college and careers.
- · Provides college-access tools and training for students, families, educators, and communities.
- Implements adult- and military-friendly degree programs and services on college campuses.
- Provides clear information for transfer and dual enrollment students about which courses and programs will transfer within Georgia's public higher education system.

ACTIVITIES AND SERVICES

- · Launch of statewide public awareness campaigns for K-12 students and for adults,
- Georgia Apply to College events at high schools with large percentages of underrepresented students,
- Financial Aid events,
- Grants to dual enrollment students in **Early College and Move On When Ready programs** to fund postsecondary education costs not covered through Georgia's ACCEL (dual enrollment) programs,
- Enhancements to **GAcollege411**, the state's free, web-based portal to help students plan for, apply, and pay for college,
- Near Peer Service Learning courses through which current college students mentor high school seniors through college admission, fi nancial aid, and enrollment,
- Community, business, and school partners working to **create a college-going culture** and promote understanding among families and students of the benefits and opportunities of postsecondary education,
- A comprehensive system of **professional development and collaboration opportunities** for school counselors, financial aid administrators, and college admissions counselors,
- · Collaborative, online degree programs that are matched with workforce needs and strategic industries,
- · Adult- and military-friendly programs, services, and outreach at multiple campuses, and
- Construction of a one stop GATRACS portal where students can find information on how to transfer and map courses and credits within and between the University System of Georgia, Technical College System of Georgia, and dual enrollment.

KEY INDICATORS AND MILESTONES

Since project inception in 2003, key indicators which result from collaborative activities have risen significantly. As of March 31, 2012:

- GAcollege411 accounts have soared by 914% to over 3.6 million Georgians.
- FAFSAs filed have increased in the same time period by 645% from 31,726 to 236,531.
- College applications through GAcollege411 online have risen 508% to 778,035 applications.
- Public higher education enrollment has climbed dramatically over the last five years. USG enrollment increased 25% to 318,027 and TCSG enrollment increased 28% to 195,366.(Fall 05-Fall 2011).
