

















USG HC Enrollment and Portfolio GSF



USG State Funded Capital, FY 2000-2018




USG State Funded Capital (Renovations & MRR), FY 2000-2018



USG State Capital Renewal (MRR) Funding Analysis 1992-2018




Age of USG Owned Building Inventory, 1900 - Present


