The Area F learning outcomes suggested below are guidelines intended to be interpreted by each institution to best fit their specific programs of study.

Students will demonstrate the following competencies:

1. The ability to discuss theatrical text, performance, and production both critically and conceptually.
2. Knowledge of playwriting and how dramatic writing shapes and is shaped by artistic and cultural forces.
3. Familiarity with a wide selection of theatre repertory including principal eras, genres, and cultural sources.
4. A practical understanding of principles, techniques and styles of acting, script analysis, directing, design, dramaturgy, stage management, and stagecraft.

Area F Course Guidelines

Eighteen (18) semester hours selected from the following:

Arts Appreciation and History	0-6 hours
Basic Theory and Performance	0-12 hours
Basic Technical Theatre and Design	0-6 hours
Literature	0-6 hours
General education electives appropriate to the goals of the theatre student	0-6 hours

Area F consists of lower-division (1000- and 2000-level) courses related to the discipline of the program of study and courses which are prerequisite to the higher level major courses.
