

As Percent of Total State Fund Budget - \$18.3 Billion





FY 2000 to FY 2012 (Total State Funds)




## State Budget Per Capita

FY 1996 to FY 2011




### **State Tax Revenue Collections**


# **University System Enrollment**


### **Full Funding vs Actual Funding**

(Billions)




### **State Funds and Tuition**

(Tuition Includes Special Institutional Fee)




## **State Funding Per Student FTE**





## **Impact of Budget Reductions**

- Eliminated low-enrollment programs
- Eliminated positions
- Increased use of part-time faculty
- Deferred maintenance
- Reduced library holdings
- Reduced operating expenditures
- Reduced course offerings/increased class size
- Discontinued Faculty and Staff Salary Increases
- Increased Health Insurance Premiums

#### **4-year institutions**



#### Total Funding vs SREB States


#### **4-year institutions**

# Georgia Full-Time Faculty Salaries vs. SREB States

#### **4-year institutions**

\$93,548

In FY 2010, Georgia ranked 7<sup>th</sup> among 4 yr colleges in the SREB states as compared to 5<sup>th</sup> in FY 2006. Georgia is slightly below the SREB median.




#### 2-year institutions

In FY 2010, Georgia ranked 11<sup>th</sup> among 2 yr colleges in the SREB states as compared to 7<sup>th</sup> in FY 2006. Georgia is approx. \$3,600 below the SREB median.

## **Governor's Budget Instructions**

### **Amended Fiscal Year 2012**

- Must Submit a 2% Reduction Plan \$35 Million
- May Not Request Additional Funding

### Fiscal Year 2013

- Must Submit a 2% Reduction Plan \$35 Million
- May Request Additional Funding for Growth
- Capital Outlay Target of \$200 Million

# Fiscal Year 2013 Request

(To Be Presented in September)

### **Formula Growth Items:**

- Enrollment Increase of 3% (Down from 7%)
- Square Footage Increase of 1%
- Health Insurance Increase of 5.2%
- Retiree Benefit Increase
- Total Formula Growth Approximately
   \$100 Million to \$105 Million
