Initiative Overview

The University System of Georgia's (USG) African-American Male Initiative (AAMI[®]) is a system-wide initiative designed to increase the number of African-American males who complete their postsecondary education from any of the USG institutions.


Its mission is to provide an integrated program model of academic and social tools that support students around adopting a positive mindset to successfully complete classes, elevate their cumulative GPAs, matriculate through each academic level and graduate.

AAMI IMPACT

ENROLLMENT

AY2017-2020 enrollment in AAMI increased each year, while during the same period total enrollment for the USG and African-American males decreased.



AVERAGE CUMULATIVE GPA

Fall 2020 cohort of Bachelor Degree Students, AAMI students exceeded the institution average GPA at 4 schools.

At 14 institutions AAMI students exceeded the average GPA for all African- American males. This is a 50% increase over 2019.



RETENTION RATES

Of the 2019 cohort, 10 programs exceeded the retention rates of the institution.

Of the 2018, 2017 and 2016 cohorts, three (3) AAMI programs' retention rates exceeded the institution rate for three consecutive years or 13.6% of active programs.




AAMI serves approximately 1000 students at 23 institutions

Supported by 44 dedicated directors and assistant directors


Twenty-five percent (25%) of our directors hold a PhD



01 WHAT IS STUDY ABROAD?

Study abroad is an academic travel experience usually tied to a specific course, internship, or degree requirement. Programs can be offered by university faculty, 3rd party companies, or international institutions.

02 FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIRED?

Most programs and courses are taught in English - most institutions do have intensive language programs available too! Studying abroad is one of the best ways to gain new language skills or increase your proficiency.

O3 CAN'T GO FOR 6 MONTHS OR A YEAR

Many programs are 1-2 weeks in length especially during the spring or fall terms. Summer programs can be longer, 2-5 weeks. Opportunities for international exchange for the semester or year is possible as well.








Horizontal Boundary Competencies –

This is a widely adopted term that captures the daily struggle to make sense of the ever-changing global, technical, diverse, digitized, politically uncertain, economically unstable, and environmentally fragile world we live in today. The VUCA state generates wicked problems.

Wicked

Problems = stubborn, unsolvable dilemmas due to their erratic nature and humanities inability to predict, fully understand, or agree on how to address them, such as climate change, border security, or economic strategy.

STUDY AWAY

- Domestic travel within the US
- Can be more cost effective
- Travel can be done by vans instead of flying

VIRTUAL EXCHANGE & INTERNSHIPS

- Connect with international students and/or businesses without leaving home through online experiences
- "Learning without borders"

INTERNATIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES

- Internationally focused courses tied to degree plans
