Change of Presidential Administration & Updates

- Much more hopeful situation positive changes may not come quickly but may not be on top
 of the priority list, agencies to fix and reassemble, definitely know about our priorities, Members
 of Congress have been made aware, fixing USCIS, more flexible COVID allowance
- Prior Administration NAFSA had zero input during Trump Administration but hope channels are reestablished
- Tracking Biden immigration changes and executive orders constantly
- SEVP unit to oversee OPT has been suspended
- SEVP has not issued any new COVID guidance and not sure that they will
- Consulates curious about when they can fully reopen no updates
- Hoping travel restrictions will lift some
- Dept. of State funding issues with lack of Visa applications being processed
- WashTech case challenge of OPT seems to have been killed for now
- USCIS fee increase still on hold court injunction still honoring
- Advocacy Date coming up in April Virtual with congressional offices
- Continue to post updates on NAFSA

Question & Answer from presentation:

<u>Exchange Visitor Program - Have</u> we heard anything from any idea of what is happening on Subpart A? – Internal hurdles – have not been adversarial as the F1 side has been – have continued to work closely with NAFSA

<u>Proposed D/S rule</u> – all pending rules are being reviewed by new administration to see if they meet new administration needs – no liaison partners agreed with this rule – lawsuit would have been filed if this had moved forward

<u>OPT Processing</u> – 60 day grace period with still no receipt notice – when guidance can we provide? Lawsuit would be one avenue but a student would need to hire counsel and file a lawsuit. Ombudsman can assist but they have a huge volume of cases but are doing the best that they can. Contact a Congressional office for help so that they understand how non-functioning USICS is – have heard good response from this avenue

<u>CDC Guidance on International Travel</u> – most recent proclamation by Biden administration – required to follow CDC recommendations or requirements? Stay at home for 7 days as well as COVID testing. Very confusing and we are not aware of a clear federal requirement of a quarantine and no enforcement. Administration intends to issue some enforcement but nothing has come out. Airline contract? Air India saying if you get deported you will have to pay for the return ticket – just a general airline agreement to protect them from the cost of someone being removed.

<u>DSO's responsibility for excessive unemployment time for OPT</u> – need for DSO's to terminate SEVIS records of students exceeding – additional information for Auto-Termination? No updates from SEVP regarding this – wait and see – will happen one of these days but not sure when

<u>Alternative course offerings with COVID continuing</u> – number 1 or 2 recommendation for DHS and Dept. of State – need more flexible and specific guidance – guidance is out of date and needs updated to reflect more varied course offerings – longer term changes to regulations
