- USG institutions conferred 43,670 degrees and awards in FY2005.
  - USG institutions conferred 24,832 bachelor's degrees in FY2005.

  - More master's degrees were conferred in education (35 percent) than any other discipline.
  - System universities awarded 949 doctorates.
- 75 percent of first-time freshmen received the HOPE Scholarship.
- 89 percent of first-time freshmen had completed the CPC in high school.
- Among 2005 high school graduates, 17.4 percent of first-time freshmen were required to take learning support courses in English, reading, or math because they were below System minimum requirements.



#### Participation by Major, 2004-2005

The Board of Regents issued a policy directive in 1995 to strengthen the international dimensions of teaching, research, and service across the University System. USG institutions have pursued an array of programs and initiatives to achieve the Board's goals. The System Council for International Education, composed of presidential appointees from each of the 34 institutions, is the primary policy advisory board on international issues. Major areas of international activity include:

Study Abroad: Board of Regents policy calls for increased participation in study abroad and exchange programs. The number of USG students studying abroad has increased from 1,850 in 1997 to 4,823 in 2004-2005.

**International Students:** Board of Regents policy seeks a diverse student body as an important ingredient in improving the education of all learners. Students from around the world attend all USG colleges and universities. The University System enrolled 18,366 students from 200 different countries in Fall 2005.

Curriculum & Instructional Technology: The System's four-year universities offer more than 50 bachelor's degrees and nearly two dozen graduate degrees in international fields. They also offer nearly 50 certificates and degree minors in international areas. The System is engaged in several major initiatives to expand access to foreign language and area studies curricula through internet-based learning.

**Foreign Languages:** USG institutions offer courses in nearly two dozen modern and classical languages. Enrollments have increased from 17,792 in Fall 1997 to 33,222 in Fall 2005. The College Preparatory Curriculum (CPC) requires two Carnegie units of the same foreign language to qualify for undergraduate admission.

Faculty Development: Each year hundreds of USG faculty participate in international seminars, research delegations, and teaching programs that strengthen their expertise and direct knowledge of other countries.

#### LEARNING SUPPORT REQUIREMENTS

#### Fall 2005

Developmental Studies programs began in Fall 1974 as a means of bringing the reading, English, and mathematical skills of marginally prepared students up to standard. In 1993, Developmental Studies policy and procedures were revised, and Developmental Studies programs were included under a broader Learning Support (LS) structure. LS programs serve students who need preparation in reading, mathematics, English, and/or other areas for success in college. Students who do not meet standards for regular admission are required to take the appropriate part(s) of the COMPASS or Collegiate Placement Exam to determine whether they are to be placed in LS courses. In admissions, placement, and exit requirements, institutions may set higher standards than required by the System. No degree credit may be earned in LS courses, but institutional credit is awarded. LS programs may serve three groups of students:

- Students required to take LS courses because they are below System minimum requirements for placement testing (430 SAT-Verbal and 400 SAT-Math and CPC English and CPC Math) and are placed with the CPE or COMPASS at the System level;
- 2. Students who are above the System minimum requirements but are required by the institution to take LS courses or other courses;
- 3. Students who volunteer to take LS courses to prepare for regular college courses.

#### **Policy**

In 1984, the University System of Georgia adopted the College Preparatory Curriculum (CPC) policy to be implemented in Fall 1988. In passing the CPC policy, the Board of Regents emphasized that success in college was dependent on strong academic preparation in high school. Board of Regents' policy requires the completion of the CPC for admission to any institution of the University System of Georgia. The CPC course requirements have been approved by the Board of Regents and endorsed by the State Board of Education.

The following courses are required of students graduating from high school in the last five years who plan to enroll in college programs leading to the baccalaureate degree in University System institutions. The courses outlined represent the minimum standards required by the Board of Regents. Each institution may set higher standards than those listed.

#### REGENTS' WRITING AND READING SKILLS REQUIREMENTS

**PURPOSE:** By a policy statement issued in 1972, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia instituted the requirement that each institution of the University System of Georgia ensure that students obtaining a transfer associate or bachelor's degree possess certain minimum skills of reading and writing. These skills are referred to as the Regents' Writing and Reading Skills. There are two System-mandated courses in writing and in reading that are designed to meet the Regents' Writing and Reading Skills requirement.

Students enrolled in undergraduate degree programs leading to the baccalaureate degree must pass the Regents' Reading Skills and Regents' Writing Skills courses as a requirement for graduation. Students may exempt these courses through examination by passing the Regents' Reading Test and the Regents' Essay Test or an approved alternative test in reading comprehension and in writing. Students who have earned 45 credit hours and have not passed or exempted the courses must take the Regents' Skills courses during each subsequent semester of enrollment. Students enrolled in a Regents' Skills course must pass the corresponding Regents' Test in order to receive a passing grade for the course.

Students may exempt the Regents' Skills Reading course by scoring at or above specified scores on the following examinations:

- · Regents' Reading Test exemption score of 61
- SAT-I Verbal exemption score of 510 (from a national administration)
- ACT Reading exemption score of 23 (from a national administration)

Students may exempt the Regents' Skills Writing course RGTE 0199 by scoring at or above specified scores on the following examinations:

- · Regents' Essay Test exemption score of 2
- · College Board Advanced Placement (AP) English Language and Composition Exemption score of 3
- · College Board Advanced Placement (AP) English Literature and Composition Exemption score of 3
- International Baccalaureate (IB) higher-level English exemption score of 4
- · SAT II English Writing exemption score of 650
- · SAT reading score of 530 and above for students who earn an "A" in English 1101 or English 1102
- · SAT reading score of 590 and above for students who earn a "B" in English 1101 or English 1102
- · ACT English score 23 and above for students who earn an "A" in English 1101 or English 1102
- · ACT English score 26 and above for students who earn a "B" in English 1101 or English 1102.

**DESCRIPTION:** The test consists of two parts, reading and essay, and is administered each semester at all System institutions. The reading part of the test is a 54-item, multiple choice test based on ten reading passages with five to eight questions about each passage. The questions are designed to assess vocabulary, comprehension, and analysis skills. The minimum passing score for the reading section is 61

For the essay, students have one hour in which to choose and write on one of the four provided topics. The completed essays are then distributed by the RTP office among seven centers in the State, where three independent raters from System institutions score each essay on a three-point scale. The final score is the rating on which at least two of the three raters agree or the middle rating if there is no agreement. Thus, an essay is given a failing grade only if at least two of the three raters assign a failing grade.

**REMEDIATION**: Students who have earned 45 semester hours of college-level credit and have not passed both parts of the test must take non-degree credit courses in remedial reading and/or writing until they have passed both parts of the test. If a student fails only one part of the test, he or she is required to repeat only that part. There is no limit on the number of times a student may take remediation or retake the test, although some institutions have policies allowing students to retake the test only when quantifiable progress has been made.

**RESULTS**: Because institutions vary in their policies concerning when students take the Regents' Test, it is unwise to use the pass rates to compare institutions. Note that statistics for repeaters include each repeat attempt.

#### CORE CURRICULUM

The institutions of the University System share a common general mission in providing a Core Curriculum for all entering freshmen. The purpose is to aid and facilitate the educational progress of students as they pursue baccalaureate degrees within and among the units of the University System. It is designed to constitute the freshman and sophomore years of study and assure the transfer student that Core Curriculum courses successfully completed at one University System institution, or a fractional part thereof, will be accepted at another University System unit and apply toward a baccalaureate degree. The Core also provides for the preservation of the maximum possible amount of institutional autonomy.

The Core Curriculum is composed of 60 semester credit hours of study divided among six areas of which 42 hours are in general education and 18 in a major area of study. Each institution has developed its Core Curriculum within the broad context of the above plan.

#### JOINT ENROLLMENT AND EARLY ADMISSION PROGRAMS

The University System of Georgia recognizes the need to provide academically talented high school students with opportunities for acceleration of their formal academic programs. This recognition has led to the development of two organized programs: 1) a joint enrollment program in which the student, while continuing his/her enrollment in high school as a junior or senior, enrolls in courses for college credit; and 2) an early admission program in which the student enrolls as a full-time college student following completion of the junior year in high school.

Minimum admissions requirements are 1) a minimum combined SAT score of 970 or equivalent ACT scores, 2) a minimum cumulative high school grade point average of 3.0 or a numerical average of 80 or higher in academic subjects, 3) exemption of all Learning Support requirements for early admission, 4) written recommendation from the high school principal or counselor, and 5) written consent of parent or guardian (if the student is a minor). In Fall 2005 2,685 students were enrolled through the joint enrollment program, a decrease of 7 percent since 2004.

#### MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Minimum admissions requirements vary by USG sector. Satisfaction of these minima does not guarantee admission to any University System institution since institutions may establish both higher and additional admissions requirements. The current admission policy was approved by the Board of Regents in 1996 and was implemented in Summer 2001. Pilot changes to two-year admissions policies were approved in 2005.

#### At research, regional, and state universities, regular admission to programs leading to the baccalaureate degree requires:

- Graduation from a high school accredited by a regional accrediting association (such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools) or the Georgia Accrediting Commission or from a public school regulated by a school system and state department of education;
- · Completion of the SAT or the American College Testing (ACT) Assessment Program;
- Completion of sixteen specified College Preparatory Curriculum units;
- A minimum SAT Critical Reading score of 430 and Mathematics score of 400 (or ACT equivalent);
- A designated score on the freshman Index (FI), which is based on a combination of a student's SAT or ACT scores and high school grade point average (HSGPA). The freshman index is:

FI = 500 x (HSGPA) + SAT Critical Reading + SAT Math or

 $FI = 500 \times HSGPA + (ACT Composite \times 42) + 88$

At state and two-year colleges and four state university "University College" units (Armstrong Atlantic State University, Augusta State University, Columbus State University, and Savannah State University), regular admission to programs leading to the baccalaureate degree requires:

- Graduation from an accredited high school or a General Educational Development (GED) credential (a student with a GED must be at least 18 years old, or the student's class must have graduated from high school);
- Completion of 16 specified College Preparatory Curriculum units with a 2.0 high school grade point average (HSGPA) or completion of the 13 units of the Technical/Career Preparatory Curriculum with a 2.2 HSGPA;

Following admission, learning support placement testing is required of all students in this sector. Students may exempt placement testing with a minimum SAT Critical Reading score of 430 and Mathematics score of 400 or ACT scores of 17 in English and 17 in math.


#### **GALILEO**

GALILEO (Georgia Library Learning Online) is Georgia's virtual library. An initiative of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, GALILEO provides access to multiple information resources, including secured access to licensed products. Through collaboration and resource sharing, GALILEO provides access to information for all Georgia citizens. Libraries benefit from the cooperative sharing of resources, with lower costs and increased access to a wider range of materials.

The community of 2,532 GALILEO sites includes the University System of Georgia, public K-12 schools, public libraries, technical colleges, and a group of private academic colleges and universities. Through a relationship with SREB, eArmyU soliders also have access.

In FY2004, USG institutions could access 126 databases indexing periodicals and scholarly journals. GALILEO contained 10,583 electronic journals, with over 5,000 journals providing articles in full-text. Other resources include encyclopedias, dictionaries, 27,441 electronic books, business directories, library catalogs, and government publications. GALILEO also includes the Digital Library of Georgia, a gateway to digitized materials in Georgia's libraries, archives, and cultural institutions on the history and culture of Georgia, including the New Georgia Encyclopedia. In FY2004, USG students, faculty, and staff performed 8,424,602 searches and retrieved 5,402,401 full-text electronic journal articles from GALILEO.
